NATIONAL LOVE PEOPLE DAY

You know, of course, that every day of the year is dedicated to one thing or another. There is National Coffee Day, National Chewing Gum Day, National Mud Pack Day, National Dress-Up Your Pet Day, etc., etc. National Days are usually fun days, food days, or important days of the year. And you thought our congressmen in Washington had little to do. They were presented with these ideas and passed by a majority vote each of these national days. Check out your “National Day Calendar” to see all of the crazy things celebrated. However, this one today might just be on target – “National Love People Day.”

It seems that too many people have taken a holiday from loving other people. Our congressmen thought that it would be a good thing if we chose to lift others up through the profound power of unconditional love. The word “unconditional” is really quite a meaningful word. Consider its synonyms (words with the same or nearly the same meaning): Wholehearted, unrestricted, complete, unequivocal. There are no boundaries or limitations with the word “unconditional”, except the limitations we erect in our own hearts. This principle is the one Jesus explained as the second greatest commandment – love your neighbor as yourself (Matt. 22:39). When you add the word **love** to **unconditional**, the power of the phrase is multiplied. We are asked to show and offer kindness and care to those around us.

Where could implementing this principle take you in your life’s journey? You might find yourself sending a card to someone who is grieving or is recovering from an illness or injury. You might be calling someone who has not been in worship recently and letting him know that he was missed. You might be inviting someone to church with you. You might be offering a free Bible Correspondence course by mail to someone who wants to study the Bible in the privacy of his own home. You might be asking that someone be visited, someone about whom you are deeply concerned. You might help when the opportunity of benevolence is extended to you. You would continue to be the example that people so badly need of someone who is honest, truthful, kind, forgiving, patient, and genuinely in love with his church family. And you certainly would **not** be one who on only one day of the year chose to love people.
